

RESOLUTION NO. 20-06

**RESOLUTION TO EXTEND THE EMERGENCY PROCLAMATION BY MAYOR  
BROOKS PERTAINING TO THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC**

---

**WHEREAS**, an emergency, namely the COVID-19 Pandemic, impacted the City of South Milwaukee beginning on March 13, 2020; and

WHEREAS, a novel strain of the coronavirus, named COVID-19 has spread throughout numerous countries including the United States; and

WHEREAS, citing the World Health Organization's declaration of a Public Health Emergency of International Concern, and the United States Department of Health and Human Services declaration of a Public Health Emergency, the Governor of the State of Wisconsin has proclaimed that a Public Health Emergency exists for the State of Wisconsin, by Executive Order #72 on March 12, 2020 and Emergency Order #12 on March 24, 2020, otherwise known as the "Safer at Home" Order, extended on April 16, 2020 by Emergency Order #28; and



WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, Mayor Brooks issued a Proclamation declaring a public health emergency, which was ratified by the South Milwaukee Common Council on March 17, 2020 that is set to expire on April 22, 2020; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to extend the public health emergency based on current State and Federal guidance.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Common Council of the City of South Milwaukee do as follows:

The emergency declaration contained in the March 13, 2020 Mayoral Proclamation, previously ratified by the Common Council on March 17, 2020 and incorporated herein, is hereby extended for 40 days, subject to any future Common Council action by way of resolution, or in the event of the Common Council being unable to meet promptly, by way of proclamation by the Mayor, to reduce such effect and time period, or to extend same, or to amend the provisions hereof.

This resolution shall take effect immediately.
