OF THE COMMON COUNCIL  
Regular Meeting

South Milwaukee  
February 16, 2010

The Regular Meeting of the Common Council was called to order by Mayor Zepecki at 7:00 p.m. On roll, all were present.

The meeting was prefaced by the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Mayor asked if there were any deletions to the agenda. McCarthy indicated that item four under Legislation & Permits should be deleted. It was so ordered. Bartoshevich requested that item one under Miscellaneous Business – Alderperson Karbowski be moved to the front of the agenda. It was so ordered.

Bartoshevich/Brooks moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes of February 2, 2010 meeting and approve them as drafted. All voted aye, motion carried.

Under Miscellaneous Business, Karbowski brought forth the matter of the noise levels from the Appleton Electric foundry. Several citizens who reside in the area commented to the Council on their concerns.

Under Finance, Stoner/Navarro moved to accept the FEMA Homeland Security-Port Security Grant. All voted aye except Karbowski who voted no. Motion carried.

Stoner/Navarro moved to adopt Resolution No. 10-05 to amend the Administrative Fee Schedule regarding tipper carts. All voted aye, motion carried.

Under Legislation & Permits, McCarthy/Karbowski moved to approve the applications for bartender licenses for the 2009-2010 period filed by Ian Haberman, 1021 E. Marquette, Oak Creek and Christine Peters, 713 College Avenue, and authorize the City Clerk to issue the licenses upon receipt of all necessary documents. All voted aye, motion carried.

McCarthy/Karbowski moved to approve the application for a “Class B” license for the 2009-2010 period to sell fermented malt beverages and intoxicating liquor filed by Giuseppis Cucino & Pizzeria, LLC/Dionisis Christofonos, Agent, for the premise at 1117 Marquette Avenue, and to authorize the City Clerk to issue the license upon receipt of all necessary documents. All vote aye, motion carried.

McCarthy/Karbowski moved to approve the change of agent for Bar 101, LLC/Ryan Gajevic, Agent, for the premise at 1301 Milwaukee Avenue (Johnny Mo’s), and to authorize the City Clerk to make the change upon receipt of all necessary documents. All voted aye, motion carried.

McCarthy/Karbowski moved to approve the applications for renewal of pigeon licenses filed by James Schmadl, 2606 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue (12 pigeons) and Michael Wood, 725 Oak Street (12 pigeons), and authorize the City Clerk to issue the licenses upon receipt of all necessary documents. All voted aye, motion carried.

Under Reports of the Mayor, Bartoshevich/Brooks moved to accept the resignation of William Saxler from the Historic Preservation Commission, with regrets. All voted aye, motion carried.

Bartoshevich/Brooks moved to adopt Resolution No. 10-06 to ratify the Emergency proclamation approved by Mayor Zepecki pertaining to the water main line rupture. All voted aye, motion carried.

Under Plan Commission, Bartoshevich informed the Council that the February 22, 2010 meeting has been canceled and rescheduled for March 8, 2010 at 6:00 p.m. The March meeting for the Plan Commission will be held on March 22, 2010 at 6:00 p.m.

Under Community Development Authority, Stoner reminded the Council that the next meeting is scheduled for February 22, 2010 at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers.

There being no further business to come before the Council the meeting was adjourned at 8:00 p.m.
