

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS
OF THE COMMON COUNCIL
Regular Meeting

South Milwaukee
March 2, 2021

The Regular Meeting of the Common Council was called to order by Mayor Brooks at 7:00 p.m. On roll, all were present except Alderperson Pieper, who was excused.

The meeting was prefaced by the Pledge of Allegiance.

There were no deletions to the agenda.

Under President of the Council, Bartoshevich/Clark moved to adopt the items in the consent agenda: a) approval of minutes from the February 17, 2021 Common Council meeting. All voted aye, motion carried.

Bartoshevich reminded Council that the April 6, 2021 Common Council meeting has been cancelled and rescheduled to April 7, 2021 due to the Spring Election.

Under Human Resources Committee, Clark/Bartoshevich moved to suspend rule 2.11 to permit giving an ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 2207 to fix and establish the amount of salaries to be paid to clinic nurse/vaccinators its first, second and third reading at this meeting. On roll call, all voted aye. Motion carried. Clark/Bartoshevich moved to adopt Ordinance No. 2208 to amend Salary Ordinance No. 2207 to fix and establish the amount of salaries to be paid to Clinic Nurse/Vaccinators, and to give the ordinance its first, second and third reading and publish a summary in the official newspaper as required by law. On roll, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Under Plan Commission, Briesemeister reminded Council that a Special Meeting of the Plan Commission is scheduled for March 9, 2021 at 6:30 p.m. (with a public hearing on proposed conditional use at 100 15th Avenue).

Under Miscellaneous Business, Bartoshevich/Clark moved to allocate \$30,000 from account 340-00000-53130 to the Bucyrus Club project, account 950-00000-47000, for façade and eligible interior commercial space improvements as permitted by the Downtown Revitalization Grant program. On roll, all voted aye. Motion carried.

Bartoshevich/Clark moved to adopt Resolution No. 21-04 extending the Emergency Declaration pertaining to the COVID-19 Pandemic. All voted aye, motion carried.

Bartoshevich/Clark moved to adopt Resolution No. 21-05 to terminate the Beautification Committee. All voted aye, motion carried.

City Administrator Mayzik gave an update on how Special Events are being handled in the city. Currently, the Health Department is advising on each individual event. At this time, the County will not open for applications or permits for the parks until June 1, 2021, so the status of Independence Day celebrations is unknown. The Special Event matter will be re-addressed early April to see if some type of policy needs to be put in place.

Clark/Bartoshevich moved to decline participation in the initiative described in Milwaukee County Resolution No. 20-540 to explore options to create a county-wide health department. On roll, all voted aye. Motion carried.

There being no further business to discuss, Stoner/Navarro moved to adjourn at 7:47 p.m. All voted aye, motion carried.
